

The author has murdered at least three men, most notoriously the serial killer and cannibal Jeffrey Dahmer, but he has educated himself in prison, found religion, and written three short books. The poems in these volumes are generally -- perhaps mercifully -- brief. They range in theme from identity and memory to inspiration and pain, and they vary in quality from emotionally honest expression to cliché-ridden doggerel.Scarver was recently interviewed by the New York Post and told a reporter that he beat Dahmer and another inmate to death because was disgusted by Dahmer's horrific crimes and by his lack of repentance, but that own crimes were a result of his poor diet, which is the flimsiest and most dubious excuse I can imagine.
