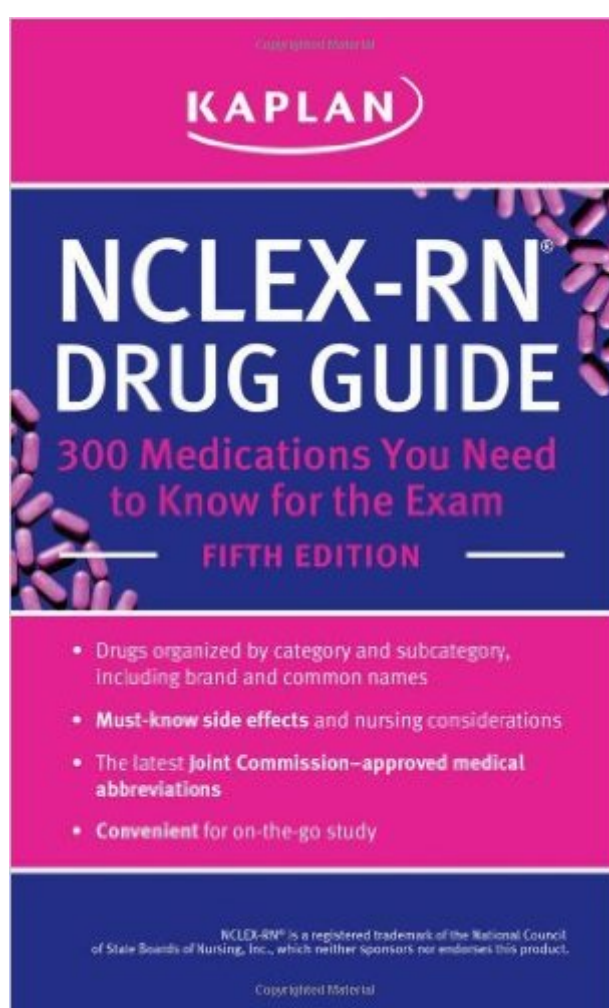

My program had sub-par pharmacology courses, so I felt I needed a study tool for the boards that was simplified. I do not think this book helped me for the NCLEX, but I do think that it would have been helpful to have during nursing school.

Not a bad book! It has a simple breakdown that lists each medication's: category, subcategory, generic name, brand name, phonetic pronunciation of the generic name, side effects, usage, and important nursing considerations. The book is organized by drug categories (Allergy and Asthma, Analgesics, Anticoagulants, Anticonvulsants, ... Respiratory Medications, Treatment/Replacement, and Women's Health). My only problem with the book is that but it doesn't have an index for looking up specific meds quickly. I have been using this site to word search within the text for the med I need to look up and then I use my book. [http:// freebooksdwload . "NCLEX" and it will pop up. You don't have to download it to be able to read the book or key word search in the text. I wouldn't recommend downloading it because it asks you to do surveys (NO THANK YOU!) and I don't trust those kinds of downloads.

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
