

In addition, Etkes draws a vivid picture of the entire generation that came under Rabbi Shneur Zalmanâ <sup>™</sup>s influence. This comprehensive biography will appeal to scholars and students of the history of Hasidism, East European Jewry, and Jewish spirituality.

A recent search on Hasidic tales returned 231 books. These tales of righteous Hasidic leaders are meant to make a point, tell a story, inspire the listener, and much more. A problem is that some of these stories are conflicting and self-contradictory. When used as a biographical vehicle, these stories are often more hagiography than biography. In Rabbi Shneur Zalman of Liady: The Origins of Chabad Hasidism (Brandeis University Press, ISBN 1611686776), author Immanuel Etkes, Professor of Modern Jewish History at the Hebrew University, Jerusalem, has written a masterful

and brilliant biography of the founder of the Chabad-Lubavitch Hasidic movement. The 9 chapters focus on Râ <sup>™</sup> Shneur Zalmanâ <sup>™</sup>s adult life, with the narrative starting from his ascent as a Hasidic leader, ending with his death fleeing with the Russian Army from Napoleon:1. Between Napoleon and AlexanderWhat makes this biography unique is that Etkes uses documents written by Râ <sup>™</sup> Shneur Zalmanâ <sup>™</sup>s himself. This is in addition to other historical documents and letters related to him. Etkes is able to create a critical analysis, yet not lose focus of the human element.
