Be forewarned: although it is called a "kit" there is nothing to put together. It's a figurine with no assembly required. I was also expecting the windows to light up, but only the top lights up.All in all it is cute and will make a nice little cupcake topper. It's just not what I expected.

This was a great purchase - I was looking at it on another website at twice the price. The TARDIS has a switch at the bottom to activate the light on top. We used this as a topper on our wedding cupcakes. The little pamphlet that comes with it is fun.

Life at work is not quite as dull when the TARDIS is sitting on my desk. I love to imagine the TARDIS would grow to full size and the Doctor would jump out and invite me in for a legendary journey through space and time.

This light-up Tardis works great. I used it in a 3D art project. I had to drill a few holes in it to attach it to the back and to rewire it in order to use a switch on the side of the frame. It held up very well and looks fantastic!

I'm a lifelong fan of Doctor Who and wanted a small Tardis to sit on my desk at home, (I'm an ex-pat Brit who has watched the show since Tom Baker's 4th Doctor was just starting to save the universe.) At just 3" tall - to the top of the light, this Tardis is great. I was surprised by the level of detail for such a small model, and the fact it lights up is a nice touch too.
